## **Dear Brothers and Sisters**,

Indeed, every Muslim who performs *hajj* (pilgrimage) hopes to obtain *hajj mabrur* (pilgrimage which is accepted by Allah). Allah the Almighty commands us to perform *hajj* as He mentioned in the Quran in Chapter 2 (*Surah Al-Baqarah*) verse (*ayat*) 196:

أَعُودُ بِٱللَّهِ مِنَ ٱلشَّيْطَانِ ٱلرَّحِيمِ وَأَتِمُّواْ ٱلْحَجَّ وَٱلْعُمْرَةَ لِلَّهِ Which means: "Complete the pilgrimages, major and minor, for the sake of Allah."

The Prophet (peace be upon him [PBUH]) said in a *hadith* narrated by Imam Ahmad:

Which means: "...a hajj which is accepted will receive no less a reward than paradise."

According to Jalaluddin as-Suyuthi, one of the signs that a person has obtained *hajj mabrur* is that he becomes a better person and strives to reduce immoral acts upon returning from *hajj*.

A positive change in personal conduct, being punctual and avoiding things that are not beneficial are signs that a person's *hajj* has been accepted by Allah the Almighty. In addition, people who achieve *hajj mabrur* always invite others to love Allah the Almighty and the Prophet (PBUH), increase their recitation of the Quran, *tahajud*, congregational prayers and *sunnah* prayers as well as enlivening mosques. If he is a businessman, civil servant, entrepreneur, etc. he is an honest and trustworthy person when working.

## **Dear Brothers and Sisters,**

Hajj mabrur does not only benefit those who performed the hajj, but also benefits their parents, wives, children, and the community.

Allah the Almighty reminds us to remember Him much as stated in the Quran in Chapter 2 (*Surah Al-Baqarah*) verse (*ayat*) 200:
